SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

2 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

3 **Slavery in Maryland**

4 FOR the purpose of expressing regret for the role that Maryland played in instituting
5 and maintaining slavery and for the discrimination that was slavery's legacy.

6 WHEREAS, The State of Maryland relied on slavery for 200 years; and

7 WHEREAS, To meet the needs of its economy, Maryland prior to 1808 imported
8 men, women, and children, torn from their homes in Africa and subjected to the
9 brutality of the Middle Passage; and

10 WHEREAS, Maryland citizens trafficked in human flesh until the adoption of
11 the Constitution of 1864; and

12 WHEREAS, Slavery subjected its victims to unspeakable cruelties, including
13 beatings, rape, and the forcible separation of family members from one another; and

14 WHEREAS, A native of Maryland, nurtured by the slave culture of our State,
15 wrote the Supreme Court's Dred Scott decision declaring African Americans incapable

1 of citizenship because they had “no rights which the white man was bound to respect”;
2 and

3 WHEREAS, Slavery fostered a climate of oppression not only for slaves and
4 their descendants but also for people of color who moved to Maryland subsequent to
5 slavery’s abolition; and

6 WHEREAS, Slavery’s legacy has afflicted the citizens of our State down to the
7 present; and

8 WHEREAS, Slavery and discrimination are utterly contrary to the principles
9 that this Nation and this State profess; and

10 WHEREAS, It is time for the State of Maryland to acknowledge the role the
11 State played in maintaining the institution of slavery and its attendant evils; now,
12 therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the State
14 of Maryland expresses profound regret for the role that Maryland played in instituting
15 and maintaining slavery and for the discrimination that was slavery’s legacy; and be it
16 further

17 RESOLVED, That the State of Maryland commits itself to the formation of a
18 more perfect union among its citizens regardless of color, creed, or race; and be it
19 further

20 RESOLVED, That the State of Maryland recommits itself to the principle that
21 all people are equal and equally endowed with inalienable rights to life, liberty, and
22 the pursuit of happiness.
