Yesterdays proceedings are read.

M<sup>r</sup> Peter Taylor & M<sup>r</sup> Jn<sup>o</sup> Brannock appear in the House Bill to enable Benj<sup>a</sup> Howard to sell certain Lands in Ann arundell County and for the entailing other Lands in Baltimore County was read the first time and ordered a Second Reading to morrow morning.

The Petition of Moses Lecompt praying relief was read and referred to Dorch<sup>r</sup> County Court for his relief.

On the peticon of Grace Brooke and Rob<sup>t</sup> Brooke to confirm Land to W<sup>m</sup> Gray.

Ordered that Notice be given to Charles Brooke the heir at Law of Robert Brooke decēd to appear next Sessions to Shew Cause if he thinks fit why a Bill shall not be brought in as pray'd, The peticon being filed in July 1716 but no process yet issued.

The Petition of James Phillips was read and referred to the Comittee of Aggrievances to examine the Allegacons of the Pet<sup>r</sup> and to make their Report thereon to the house. p. 14

The Peticon of Nathaniel Ashcom of Calvert County Gent. & the Peticōn of John Seagger of S<sup>t</sup> Mary's County were read and referr'd for further Consideration.
