

Are there any announcements by committee chairmen? Delegate Koss?

DELEGATE KOSS: Mr. President, I have the honor to announce that this morning the Committee on Suffrage and Elections by acclamation elected as its vice-president Nicholas M. Schloeder. I would also like to announce the next meeting of the full committee will be at 1:00 P.M. on Monday. Thank you.
