

Mr. Stephenson, from the Select Committee to whom the leave was referred, reported a bill, entitled an Act to repeal Chapter 411, passed January Session 1870, entitled an Act to add additional Sections to Article sixty-nine of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Officers," regulating and prescribing the number and compensation of officers of the Senate and House of Delegates, and repealing all Acts inconsistent therewith.
