Leave was granted to a select committee of three to introduce a bill to amend the charter of the United Cities Land company;

And Messrs. Maxwell, Gordon and Durant, constituted said committee.

Mr. Kessler presented the petition of Mr. Wolfe and one hundred other citizens of Hauver's District, Frederick county, against the removal of the polls;

Mr. Sangston, from a select committee, made the following

REPORT:

The special committee appointed under the resolution of June 11th, 1861, to examine generally into the affairs of the Maryland Penitentiary, beg leave respectfully to report, that they organized in the city of Frederick on the 25th of June, and selected Mr. Thomas H. Moore, as clerk, and adjourned to meet on the 1st of July, in the city of Baltimore, at the Maryland Penitentiary.

Their duties, as pointed out in the resolution and order above referred to, consisted of an investigation of the following matters:

1st. The memorial of John H. Duvall and William Howard, asking relief from losses growing out of the destruction of their property by fire.
