WHEREAS, this legislature contracted with Jonas Green to print the daily journal of the house of delegates at its present session, and with William M'Neir to print the daily journal of the senate, the said Green and M'Neir also to print the number of each journal for distribution to the respective persons entitled to a copy thereof, at the rate of \$3 25 per page; Therefore,

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and directed, to pay to the said Jonas Green and William M'Neir, or their orders, at the above rate of \$3 25 per page, for the printing so contracted for, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, upon their producing a certificate from the clerk of the council that the work has been completed agreeably to contract, and is ready for distribution.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Andrew Slicer, messenger to the senate, and John Quynn, door-keeper to the house of delegates, the sum of sixty dollars each, for taking care of the furniture in their respective rooms during the recess of the legislature.

RESOLVED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Queen-Anne's county court be and hereby is authorised and empowered, to make such allowance to Thomas Ringgold, one of the securities of Nathan Betton, late sheriff of said county, against whom the said state obtained a judgment in said county court at the May term thereof, in the year eighteen hundred and twenty, for any amerçiements, fines or forfeitures, as the said Betton was entitled to be allowed, and also to credit and allow the said Ringgold for any payments that may have been made on execution, or otherwise, for and on account of the money due said state or said judgment.
