No. 45.

Passed March 12

Half pay of private

A resolution in favor of John Dotrow, of Frederic county:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Dotrow, of Frederick county, or to his order, during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.

Half pay of private

A resolution in favor of Henry Shean, of Baltimore county.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Henry Shean, of Baltimore county or to his order, during life, in half yearly payments a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.

Warrant for 50
acres granted

A resolution authorising a grant to the heirs of Andrew Lord, who was a soldier in the Maryland line during the revolutionary War, of fifty acres of vacant land, west of Fort Cumberland, in Allegany county.

Resolved, That the register of the land office for the Western Shore be and he is hereby authorised and required to issue to the heirs of Andrew Lord, of the city of Baltimore, a soldier of the Maryland line during the revolutionary war, or if there be no heirs then and in that case to Amelia Lord, widow of the said Andrew Lord, a special warrant for fifty acres of vacant land, lying to the Westward of Fort Cumberland, in Allegany county, and to grant a patent for the said quantity of land without requiring payment or proof of payment, for the same, or any composition money therefor.

Arms

A resolution requiring the Armorer at Annapolis, to deliver to D. H. Bingham, of Frederick county, certain arms and accoutrements.

Resolved, That the Armorer at Annapolis be, and he is hereby required to deliver to D. H. Bingham, of Frederick county, any arms and accoutrements, not exceeding seventy-five of each, which the said Bingham may select, on his giving such security for the safe keeping, and return of the same as the Governor and Council may require.
