Resolution in favour of Mary Chapman, of Georgetown, District of Columbia. Passed Mar. 18, 1832

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Mary Chapman of Georgetown, District of Columbia, in consideration of services rendered by her deceased husband, Henry H. Chapman, a Lieutenant in the revolutionary war, or to her order, during widow-hood, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a Lieutenant.

Resolution relative to a Geological Survey.

Passed March 16.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor and Council be, and they are hereby authorised to appoint an assistant to the Engineer to be appointed on the subject of a State Map, whose duty it shall be to act in conjunction with said Engineer, and the said assistant shall make the necessary geological researches, and report to the Governor and Council before the next session of the General Assembly, upon the expediency, and probable cost of a Geological survey of the state; and the Governor and Council shall allow such compensation for the services to be rendered under this resolution, as in their judgment they may deem just and proper.

Resolution in favour of the heirs and representatives of the securities of William Barrow, deceased, late of Dorchester county. Passed March 16

WHEREAS, it is represented to this General Assembly, by the petition of William D. Barrow, in behalf of the heirs and representatives of William Barrow, deceased, that the State holds a claim against them, for a tract of land, being a part of the Indian land, in Dorchester county, which was purchased by William Barrow, deceased; AND WHEREAS,
