

CHAP. 379. B. Calvert, Hauson Penn, Benjamin O. Lownds, Charles H. Carter, and Richard H. Stuart, in conformity with the rules prescribed by the above recited act.

Real estate

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the said company shall have the right to purchase and hold land in the county of Prince George's, not exceeding one thousand acres.

In force

Sec. 4. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall be in force from the passage thereof.

CHAPTER 378.

Passed April 5, 1839, *An act to alter the place of holding Elections in the fifth, or Parson's district, in Worcester County.*

Place prescribed

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the place for holding all elections, after the passage of this act, in the fifty, or Parson's district, in Worcester county, shall be at the tenement or house, now and heretofore occupied as an office, by Levin G. Irving, and Zedekiah H. Williams, adjoining the tavern house of Bennet L. Fish, in the town of Salisbury, in said county, and all laws or parts of laws inconsistent with this act, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 379.

Passed April 5, 1839, *An act to authorize the Mayor and Councilmen of the Town of Cumberland, to open and keep open, all the public Streets, Lanes and Alleys in the Town of Cumberland, and for other purposes.*

Powers conferred

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the mayor and councilmen of the town of Cumberland, be, and they are hereby authorized, in their discretion, to have opened, and keep open all the public streets, lanes and alleys within the corporate jurisdiction of the said town, any law now in existence to the contrary notwithstanding.
