*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Robert Wason, (executor of Walter McAttee, late of Allegany county, deceased,) be allowed ten days from the passage of this resolution, to compound on a certificate of survey for a tract of land called "Interior" lying in the county aforesaid, and containing fifty six and three eighths acres; and the Treasurer of the Western Shore is hereby authorised to receive the same, thereby making the certificate for said tract of land as valid as if the same had been compounded on in due time; *provided nevertheless*, that rights acquired in any part or the whole of said land, by other persons since the issuing of the warrant on which said survey was made, shall not be affected by any thing contained in this resolution.*
