CHAPTER 291.

Passed Feb 27, 1850. *An act entitled, an act to divorce Edward Carty, of Kent County, from his wife Mary Ann Carty.*

Divorced

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Edward Carty, of Kent county, be and he is hereby divorced from his wife, Mary Ann Carty, a vinculo matrimonii.

CHAPTER 292.

Passed Feb. 27, 1850. *An act to divorce Robert Galway, of Baltimore City, from his wife, Margaret Galway.*

Divorced.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Robert Galway, of Baltimore city, be and he is hereby divorced from his wife, Margaret Galway, a vinculo matrimonii.

CHAPTER 293.

Passed Mar. 5, 1850. *An act relating to consignments of Agricultural Productions, for sale, to Factors and other Agents.*

Rights, etc., of commission merchants, etc. in relation to consignments

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, no consignment of tobacco, wheat, rye, corn, oats, or any other agricultural productions whatever, by the grower, or producer, or other owner, to any commission merchant, factor, agent, or other bailee, or consignee whatever, for the purposes of sale, for the use and benefit of such grower, producer, or other owner, shall be held, deemed, or taken to vest in such com-*
