Said bill was then sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, from the select committee to which was referred the bill entitled, An act relating to the alms house for Dorchester county, reported it with the following amendments:

In the 2d line of the 1st section after the words, “of the,” insert the words, “tenth article of the Code of.”

After the word, “repealed,” in the 3d line of the 1st section add the words, “and the following enacted as a substitute therefor.”

In the 1st line of the 2d section, strike out the words, “and be it enacted that.”

In the 2d line of the 2d section, strike out the words, “levied for the use of the alms house,” and insert in lieu thereof the words, “so levied.”

Strike out the title of the bill, and insert the following:

“A bill entitled, An act to repeal the 25th section of the 10th article of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the alms house, of Dorchester county, and to enact a section as a substitute therefor.”

Which were read and adopted.
