(House Joint Resolution No. 7)

A House Joint Resolution concerning

Judicial Compensation Commission Report

FOR the purpose of proposing an alteration to the compensation of the members of the Judiciary in this State, pursuant to Section 1-708 of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

WHEREAS, Section 1-708(b)(2) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland establishes a 7-member Judicial Compensation Commission appointed by the Governor with 2 members appointed on nomination of the President of the Senate, 2 members appointed on nomination of the Speaker of the House of Delegates, 1 member appointed on nomination of the Maryland Bar Association, and 2 members appointed at large. The Judicial Compensation Commission is constituted as follows: appointments made on the nomination of the President of the Senate: John Paterakis and Elizabeth Buck; appointments made on the nomination of the Speaker of the House of Delegates: Bruce A. Kaufman and Charles R. Jenkins, Sr.; appointment made on the nomination of the Maryland Bar Association: J. Michael
