

~~(D)~~ (D) (1) [The reciprocal fishing privileges granted to persons holding valid fishing licenses from Virginia, West Virginia, and Pennsylvania by this section are valid only for the main stem of the Potomac River and Conowingo and Youghiogeny Reservoirs. A person may not fish in any other Maryland water, including the tributaries of the Potomac River and Conowingo and Youghiogeny Reservoirs, without obtaining an appropriate Maryland fishing license.] **THE RECIPROCAL FISHING PRIVILEGES GRANTED BY THIS SECTION TO A PENNSYLVANIA RESIDENT HOLDING A VALID FISHING LICENSE FROM PENNSYLVANIA ARE VALID ONLY FOR THE CONOWINGO AND YOUGHIOGHENY RESERVOIRS.**

(2) **THE RECIPROCAL FISHING PRIVILEGES GRANTED BY THIS SECTION TO A WEST VIRGINIA RESIDENT HOLDING A VALID FISHING LICENSE FROM WEST VIRGINIA ARE VALID ONLY FOR THE MAIN STEM OF THE POTOMAC RIVER, THE NORTH BRANCH OF THE POTOMAC RIVER, AND THE JENNINGS RANDOLPH RESERVOIR OPPOSITE THE SHORE OF WEST VIRGINIA.**

(3) **THE RECIPROCAL FISHING PRIVILEGES GRANTED BY THIS SECTION TO A VIRGINIA RESIDENT HOLDING A VALID FISHING LICENSE FROM VIRGINIA ARE VALID ONLY FOR THE MAIN STEM OF THE POTOMAC RIVER OPPOSITE THE SHORE OF VIRGINIA.**

~~(E)~~ (E) If a state fails to maintain the reciprocal fishing privileges in accordance with an approved agreement, the Secretary may revoke the reciprocal fishing privileges accorded to those holding licenses issued by that state by publishing a notice of revocation in the Maryland Register and notifying the head of the appropriate licensing agency for that state.

CHAPTER 60

(House Bill 231)

AN ACT concerning
