

### D.A.R. Chapter Holds Meeting

Plans for two dedicatory services were made last week by Dorset Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution at the final meeting of the 1939-1940 year which was held at the Oakley Beach Hotel. Yearly reports by officers and chairmen summarized the work which the chapter has done during the year.

The dedicatory exercises will be held on Memorial Day, May 30th, when the flag and flag pole at the Upper Elementary School will be dedicated, and the Old Fire Bell, appropriately mounted, will be placed on the Court House Green. The exercises at the school will take place at 3 P. M. and will be followed immediately by the dedication of the old bell.

At the business session the Regent, Mrs. Duncan L. Noble, reported on the State Board meeting which she attended in Baltimore. This meeting was presided over by Mrs. George H. Strapp, the newly elected regent, who announced that there are now 157 members of the Maryland State Society. The Board, at this meeting endorsed the name of Sidney Lanier for the Hall of Fame.

Reports on the 49th Continental Congress, held last month in Washington, were made by the Regent, Mrs. Ralph C. Lemm and Mrs. Frank M. Dick. Mrs. Lednum spoke on the vice-presidents general and Mrs. Dick retiring first vice-president general of the National Society spoke on the vice-president general and their terms of office. Mrs. Noble also spoke on a National Defense meeting which she attended while in Washington.

The chapter voted to give a gross of small flags to be placed on soldiers' graves in the county on Memorial Day. The Regent announced that all committees will be made up of the same

members for the coming year, with the exception of the program committee. At the conclusion of the meeting the Chapter adjourned for the summer months and will resume its meetings in October.

santhemums, fields of clover, orange, blossoms, cherry blossoms and American beauty roses. The New York World's Fair will be represented in special displays, one of which depicts three fountains 30 feet high.

Outstanding in the program will be a Battle in the Clouds which will spread over 2,500 feet. Made up of six set pieces it included 35 electric fountains, 36 comet stars and 36 electric shells. This display will be foisted by a Batte Scene, realistically represented.


