

Mr. Shriver delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Frederick county, praying that certain persons may be vested with power to sell part of four acres of ground, formerly purchased to erect a school thereon, for the purpose of enabling them to build a school house and place of worship thereon; which was read and referred to Messrs. Shriver, Swearingen and T. Jones.

Mr. Forwood delivers a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of Alexander Rigdon, of Harford county; and Mr. R. Neale delivers a bill entitled, An act to repeal all such parts of the acts of assembly of this state as require the payment of twenty-five shillings for a marriage licence; which were read.

Mr. Rogerson delivers a petition from Charles Sewall, late a revolutionary officer, praying for a compensation for his services; which was read and referred to Messrs. Rogerson, C. Dorsey and Stonestreet.

Mr. Abraham Jones delivers petitions from Thomas Burgess, and Ann Richards, of Montgomery county, praying to be supported out of the poor's house; which were read and referred to Messrs. A. Jones, Evans and Owens.

Mr. Abraham Jones delivers a petition from Leonard Combs, of Montgomery county, praying that the administrators of the late sheriff of Montgomery county, may be authorised to convey to him a parcel of land purchased from the said sheriff; which was read and referred to Messrs. A. Jones, Evans and Owens.

Mr. Bowles delivers a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Peter Rouck, and Mary his wife, of Washington county; which was read.

On motion by Mr. C. Dorsey, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act making an uniform provision for the surviving officers and soldiers of the late Maryland line, in the revolutionary war. *Ordered*, That Messrs. C. Dorsey, Street, Swearingen, R. Neale, Veazey, Emmerson, Boerstler, T. N. Williams and Stevens, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Donaldson, the following resolution was read the first and second time by special order assented to and sent to the senate:

*Resolved*, That Jehu Chandler print the laws and votes and proceedings of the General Assembly, and perform such other services as have been actually performed by the printer employed by the state, or may be required by the legislature, or either branch thereof, or by the governor and the council.

On motion by Mr. C. Dorsey, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to alter and amend all such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state, as will permit the several judges and chancellors of this state, hereafter to be appointed, to discharge judicial duties, after they shall severally arrive at the age of sixty. *Ordered*, That Messrs. C. Dorsey, Sanders and Donaldson, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.
