

On motion by Mr. Randall, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An additional supplement to the act entitled, An act to establish a market, and to build a market-house in the Western Precincts of Baltimore, and for the regulation of the same. *Ordered*, That Messrs Randall Pechin and Brown be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to make valid the will of William Baird, late of Washington county, deceased, endorsed, "will pass," ordered to be engrossed; and a communication from the executive enclosing a communication from the commissioners appointed by the state of New York, enclosing their report of the rout of an inland navigation from Hudson river to Lake Ontario and Lake Erie, together with a map of the western part of the state of New York, exhibiting the rout of the contemplated canal; which was read.

The house adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 1811.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.

The speaker having by letter, notified the house of the necessity of his absence for a few days, the house proceeded to ballot for a speaker pro tem; the ballots being deposited in the ballot-box, on examination thereof it appeared that John Bowles, Esquire, was elected.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for opening and extending a street and communication between Gough and Wolfe streets in the city of Baltimore was sent to the senate.

Mr. Street delivers a petition from William, Joshua and Aquila Amoss, of Harford county, praying that a jury may be appointed to assess the damages sustained by a road passing through their land; which was read and referred to Messrs. Street, H. Hall and Sanders.

Mr. Lewis Duvall delivers a petition from Thomas Wilmer and Henrietta his wife, of the city of Annapolis, praying to be supported out of the poor's house; which was read and referred to Messrs. L. Duvall, A. Dorsey and Belt.

Mr. Downey delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Hager's-town, praying for an alteration in their market law; which was read and referred to Messrs. Downey, Børstler and T. B. Hall.

Mr. A. Dorsey delivers a petition from Thomas Miller of Anne-Arundel county, praying to be supported out of the poor's house; which was read and referred to Messrs. A. Dorsey, Belt and Zachariah Duvall.

Mr. Abraham Jones delivers the following report:
