

And the engrossed bills from No. 1 to No. 3, inclusive, severally endorsed, "read and assented to;" which were severally read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a memorial from the commanding officers of the regiment of artillery attached to the 3d brigade, praying they may be furnished with powder at the expense of the state; which was read, and referred to the next General Assembly.

Mr. Bowles delivers the journal of accounts; which was read the first and second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Bowles delivers a bill entitled, An act for the payment of the journal of accounts; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Randall, the following message was read:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, *June 18, 1812.*

*Gentlemen of the Senate,*

We have finished the business before us, and are ready to close the session immediately. We have nominated Messrs. Randall and Handy a committee on the part of this house, to join the gentlemen to be nominated by your house, to wait on the governor and request his attendance in the senate chamber to sign and seal the laws, according to the constitution of this state.

On motion by Mr. Howard, the question was put, that the further supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state be reconsidered? Determined in the negative. Which bill was sent to the senate.

The engrossed bills, Nos. 4 and 5, were read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The report on the petition of Jehu Chandler, printer to the state, was read the second time, and the question put, that the house assent to the resolution therein contained.
