The senate met.—Present the same members as on yesterday. Messrs. W. Hollingsworth and Hebb appeared in the senate.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. L. Hollingsworth leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Chesapeake Insurance Company. Ordered, That Messrs. L. Hollingsworth, N. Williams and Hebb be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. L. Hollingsworth from the committee delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Chesapeake Insurance Company; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain property of John Ridgely a minor; and a bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the court of Montgomery county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of John Daily, severally passed by that house Dec. 30, 1813; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act directing the manner in which justices of the peace shall qualify, and for other purposes, and the bill entitled, an act authorising William G. D. Worthington, to sell the real estate of Thomas Contee, late of Prince George's county, deceased, were severally read the second time, and will pass.

### FRIDAY, December 31, 1813.

THE Senate met.—Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Lloyd.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act authorising William G. D. Worthington to sell the real estate of Thomas Contee, late of Prince George's county, deceased, and the bill entitled, an act directing the manner in which justices of the peace shall qualify and for other purposes, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Stephen presented the petition of Edward Norwood, relative to the making of a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the District of Columbia; which was read and referred to Messrs. Stephen, Hawkins and Fenwick to consider and report thereon.

Mr. L. Hollingsworth presented a petition from the commissioners and assessors appointed under the law for opening and extending Pratt-street, in the city of Baltimore, praying a supplement to said law, enabling them to execute their trust, to be paid the sums of money respectively due them; which was read and referred to Messrs. L. Hollingsworth, Stephen and N. Williams to consider and report thereon.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of David Williamson; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Nathan Trail, of Montgomery county; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Jonathan Cox, of Allegany county; the bill entitled, an act to alter and change the name of William Prentiss Swift, of Baltimore city, to that of William Roberdean Swift, and the bill entitled, an act relating to fesses covert, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following resolution:

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to Jehu Chandler, for printing the laws and votes and proceedings of May session, 1813, the sum of three hundred and ten dollars, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

Which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to lay out a road from Wm. Sinclair's plantation to Vaughan's Mine Run and Gunpowder Mills, and from thence to Owl Branch, passed at November session, 1802, was read the second time, and will pass with proposed amendments.

#### *Amendments proposed.*

1st. Strike out the preamble.

2nd. Strike out the word "said" in the last line but one of the bill.

3rd. Add to the end of the bill, the words "to which this act is a further supplement."

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Henry Howard, (of John,) of Montgomery county, read the second time, and will pass, with the proposed amendments.

#### *Amendments proposed.*

1st. After the word "been" in the 10th line of the bill insert the article "a."

2nd. In the last line of the bill after the word "consequently," insert "upon."

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of John Kimes, late of Allegany county, read the second time, and will pass with the proposed amendment.
