BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, December 14, 1814.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay annually to Richard Wheeler, of Charles county, an old revolutionary soldier, a sum of money in quarterly payments equal to the half pay of a corporal, during his life, as a further remuneration for the services rendered his country, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Joseph Smith, late a captain in the revolutionary war, first of marines and afterwards in the Maryland line, or to his order, annually in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a captain, as a further remuneration and provision to him in his indigent circumstance and advanced life, for those services by which his country was so essentially benefitted.
