

the direction of the joint committee on the State Library, to exchange or otherwise dispose of all the surplus books belonging to the state, excepting twelve copies of all compilations of laws, reports and documents, which are to be retained for the use of the legislative, executive and judicial departments of the government, and the proceeds of the same, the joint committee is authorised and directed to lay out in the purchase of law books, and other works for the use of the said library.

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and assented to.

Mr. Lantz submitted the following resolutions:

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby directed to pay to John I. Jacob or order, the sum of twenty-two dollars and twelve cents, it being the amount of composition money paid by him into the treasury, upon certain lands in Allegany county, which were represented to be liable to escheat, but were afterwards found to have been escheated and patented to a certain Edward Norwood.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That so much of the resolution in favor of John I. Jacob, a revolutionary soldier, passed at December session 1820, number 27, as requires the land granted by said resolution, to be located to the westward of Fort Cumberland, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Which were severally read.

Mr. Rogerson submitted the following resolution:

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby required to pay to Sarah Auld, of Talbot county, widow of Daniel Auld, a soldier of the revolution, or to her order, such sum as may appear to be due her said husband, Daniel Auld, at the time of his decease.

Which was read.

Mr. Johnson reported a bill, entitled, An act to regulate the election of the clerk of the county court, and register of wills, for Frederick county.

Mr. Hollman reported a bill, entitled, An act to establish a bank, and incorporate a company under the name of "The Washington County Bank," at the town of Williamsport, in Washington county.

Mr. Sothoron reported a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for marking and bounding land; passed at November session 1786, as relates to St. Mary's county;
