On motion by Mr. Turner, of Baltimore,

Said report was amended by inserting after the word "the," in the first line thereof, the words "majority of the."

Mr. Ely moved to amend said report by striking out the first and second resolutions, and inserting in lieu thereof the following.

*Resolved*, That we do not agree with the Legislature of Delaware in its opinions of President Jackson, but we do agree with the Legislatures of Maine, New Hampshire, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia, North Carolina, Georgia, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Illinois, Missouri, and with the majority of the people of Ohio, Kentucky, Louisiana, Indiana and Maryland, that the best interests of the country demand the re-election of Andrew Jackson, and that his administration has been conducted most honourably and triumphantly for himself, and most serviceably for the United States."

On the question being put, on striking out, it was determined in the negative.
