Which was read,

Mr. Brown moved to amend said amendment by adding at the end thereof, the following,

And, provided further, that said right of ownership, shall not carry with it the right to impose a charge upon the persons that may come into the open space around said markets and without the market houses, to vend produce therein.

Which was read.

Mr. Merrick moved to refer said bill and amendments to the consideration of the next General Assembly of Maryland,

Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, on the amendment to the amendment, as proposed by Mr. Brown,

Resolved in the affirmative,

The question then recurred, and was put on the amendment as amended, and determined in the negative;

The question was then put, shall the said bill pass,

Resolved in the affirmative.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Merchants Fire Insurance company of Baltimore, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order, and severally assented to, with the exception of the last amendment;

Mr. Spence moved that the last amendment be rejected;

Determined in the negative,

The question was then put, will the house adopt the amendment,

Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution relative to appointing commissioners to have a survey made, and estimate the cost of a rail road &c., endorsed, "assented to," ordered to be engrossed;

And, delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, an act to authorise the conveyance of the ground therein mentioned,

Which was and read referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

On motion of Mr. Ely,

The House adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
