

Also, the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, relating to Run alley, in the city of Baltimore, passed December session 1834,

And, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to condemn and make public a certain alley therein named, near Baltimore street, between Eutaw and Paca streets; severally endorsed, "will pass," and severally ordered to be engrossed,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the appointment of commissioners and the division of Charles county into school districts, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order, severally assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed,

Also, the resolution directing the Librarian to furnish certain indexes of the Laws of Maryland,

And, the resolution in favor of the Commissioners for Anne Arundel county, severally endorsed "assented to," ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Merrick submitted the following order,

Ordered, that it shall in future be competent, under the rules of this House, for a call of the House to be made, whenever required by seven members previously to the commencement by the Clerk to call the yeas and nays upon any proposition.

Which was twice read.

Mr. Teackle moved to lay said order on the table,

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Ely moved to amend said order by adding at the end thereof, the following,

"Provided, that the house shall not proceed to any other business before the yeas and nays are finally recorded,"

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred, and was put, will the house adopt the order,

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Ely called for the yeas and nays.

Mr. McLean, moved that the house adjourn,

Resolved in the affirmative.

The House accordingly adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
