Resolved, that the said Treasurer be, and he is hereby required to pay said drafts when presented, out of that portion of the avails of the free school fund heretofore directed to be invested annually for the benefit of Charles county,

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and assented to.

Mr. McLean, chairman of the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to authorise the widening of Carpenter's alley in Baltimore, reported the same without amendment,

The said bill was then read a first, and by special order, a second time and passed.

Mr. McLean, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, reported a bill, entitled, an act to make valid a deed therein mentioned,

Which was read the first, and by special order a second time, and passed.

Mr. McLean, chairman of the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act relating to the grading of streets in the city of Baltimore, reported the same without amendment,

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Bryan reported a bill, entitled, an act to lay out, alter or change a road in Prince George's county.

Mr. Gough reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act for building a bridge over Deer Creek, in Harford county, passed December session 1832, chapter 136.

And, Mr. Brookhart reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the town of Boonsborough, and the several additions thereto,

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Dulany, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by him as chairman of the committee on insolvency, entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas Carbell, of Washington county,

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.
